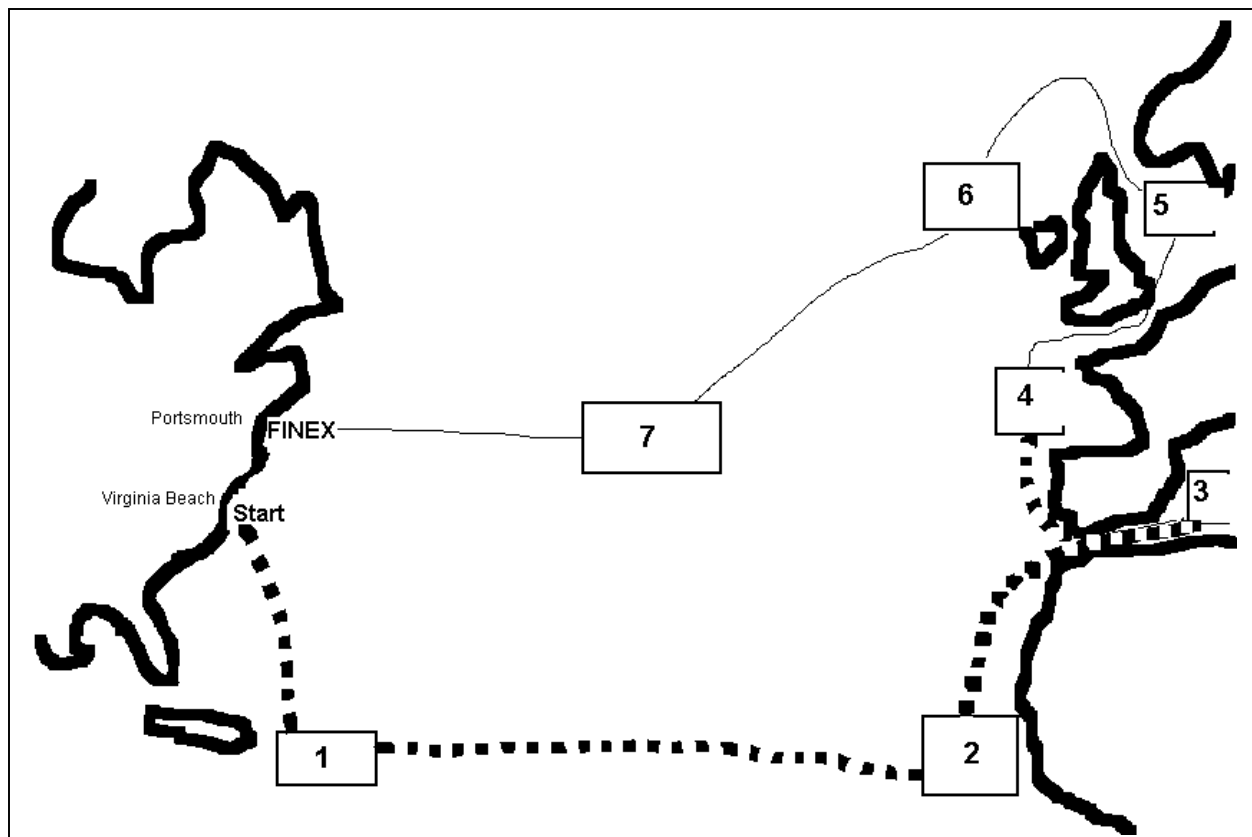

**"Wally" Walraven – our duty Storekeeper and an officer of our association, died unexpectedly on May 11<sup>th</sup>. He will be greatly missed as he personally worked on almost every reunion the Sirago ever had and was aboard the Sirago from 51-59 as a torpedoman.**

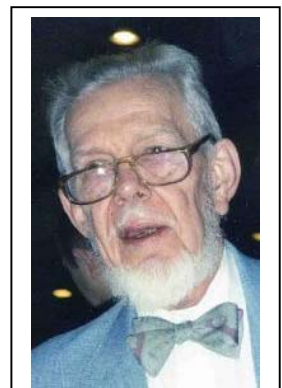
