Note from Dan Durham

Dan Durham who was a LT aboard the Sea Leopard and also was aboard the Grampus in the mid-60s is coming to this reunion, for reasons beyond just wanting to swap sea stories. He writes:

I had to make the hotel reservation because my daughter, Diane, who has lived in the Norfolk area for several years, recently moved to New London, CT. She has just completed a two year tour as CO of the Coast Guard Cutter FORWARD. The FORWARD was in GITMO in January when the earthquake hit Haiti. They got underway and were the first responders to Haiti, arriving early the next morning. For several days Diane was the on-site commander in Port-a-Prince, until the big ships arrived. She used her helicopter to survey the damage and to transport people for medical care. The FORWARD also acted as air traffic control for the airport until the Air Force brought in a team to do that. Diane was quoted in the New York Times and USA Today and interviewed on CNN, and was introduced by the President at the July 4th picnic at the White House.

Separate from that incident, she was the recipient of the Witherspoon Award that the CG awards to one person a year for excellence in leadership. She has now reported for duty at the CG Academy as Director of Professional Training.

I like to think that Diane has done so well because she spent some time aboard the SEA LEOPARD, in port, while still an infant. She was first aboard before she was a month old. She got her nautical start on a smoke boat.

Reunion 2005

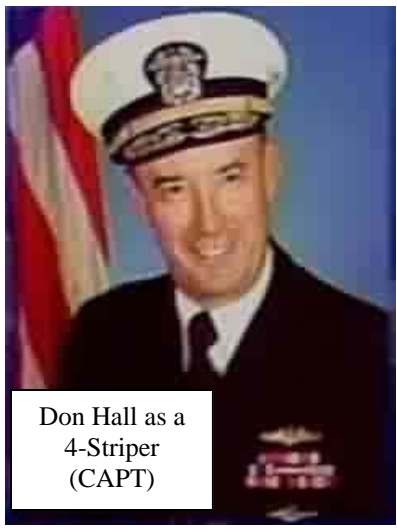
This note was sent to me from Linda Beatty, "Clyde" Beatty's widow:

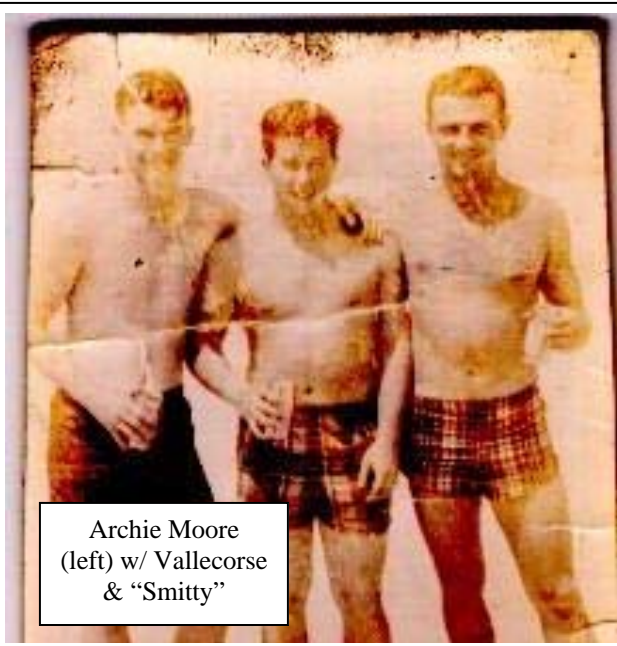
Ray Gundy

Ray and I attended several of the sub reunions and he always enjoyed meeting old shipmates and trading stories. I hope you can remember him at the next reunion.

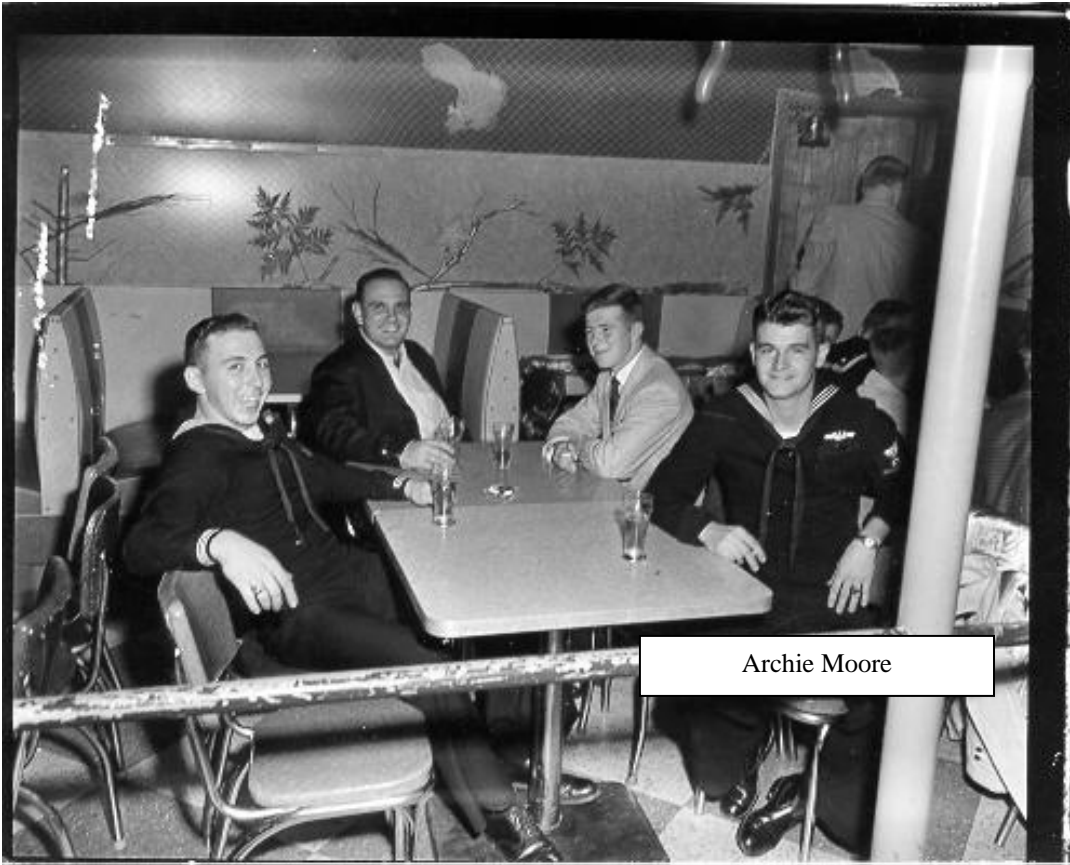
